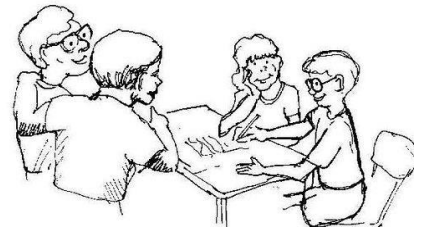


Everybody needs a Buddy

Our professional learning/development community is focusing on Post School Options for our senior students. We are aiming to provide a successful transition between school and life after school.

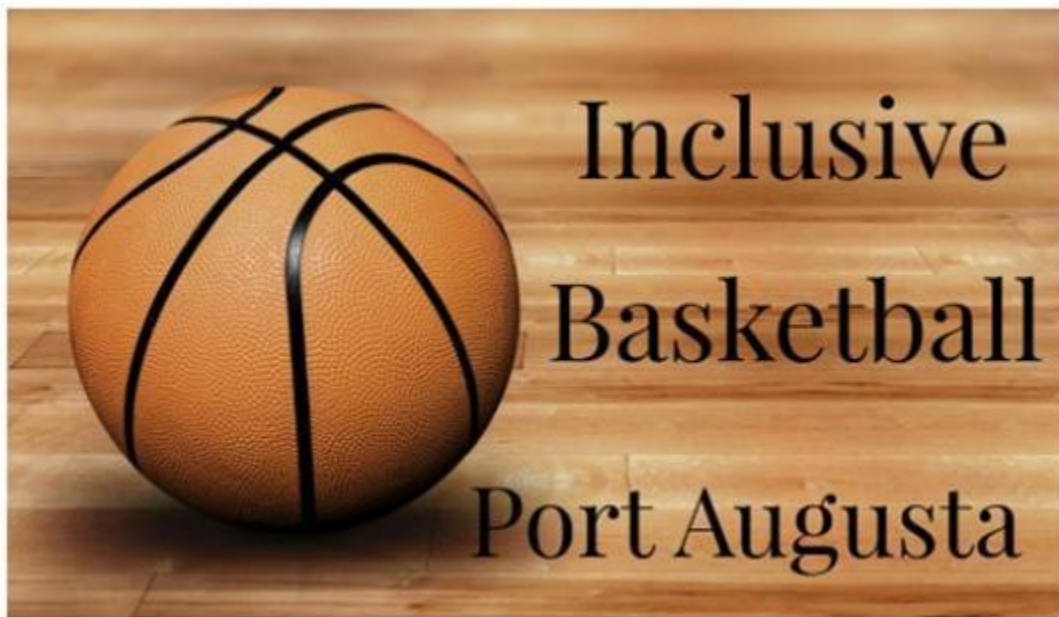
We are working towards:

- 1) Developing a tracking document to map pathways for individual students.
- 2) Increasing our knowledge of and connection with local supporting agencies. This will allow us to effectively use their services to best achieve outcomes for our students.

We are really enthusiastic about our learning project and look forward to sharing our progress with you.

Connecting to the Broader Education and Local Community

- 1) The intended outcome of the first project is to increase community engagement and to nurture a sense of belonging. Mrs L, Richa and Julia are working to highlight key events throughout the year for students to participate in. We want students to connect with the broader community by participating in local events. Examples include NAIDOC Week and the Christmas pageant. We are aiming to increase community involvement within our school.
- 2) The intended outcome of the second project is to build connections between students at Port Augusta Special School and a mainstream primary school to promote inclusion and understanding amongst diverse groups. We aim to support social development through a buddy program and building a broader outlook on education. This will be trialled in Term 2.
