Welcome to the second edition of our newsletter. Our new website is beginning to take shape and over the next few weeks or so, we will be uploading revised documents and up-to-date copies of the Context Statement, Site Improvement Plan, Annual Report and various policy documents, including the new Government-directed Mobile Phone Policy for schools in SA. For those who haven't heard, as from the beginning of Term 3, all schools across SA will be implementing a 'No Mobile Phone at Schools' Policy. We will be developing ours over the coming weeks and will keep you advised of where we are up to in the developmental stage. Decisions will need to be made around where students can hand up their phones for safe keeping during the day. My advice is, unless there is a very sound reason for mobile phones to be brought to school, that students leave them home. We will be requiring that all phones brought to school are submitted to a central place for safe-keeping – students will not be permitted to keep mobile phones or use them during school operating hours. (Not that mobile phones are an issue at our site, but we must still comply with Department requirements). More to come on this one.

Our Governing Council held its AGM recently and we head into 2023 with much the same Committee, with the welcome edition of Tania Evans. It is good to have a stable group made up of parents predominantly with young children, as this means we could have good representation for some time to come. It is with extreme pleasure we welcome back Mick Bunder as the Chairperson for another year and I, as principal, look forward to working with Mick in 2023.


